Referendum: 2 May 2019

Information Statement

A referendum relating to the adoption of the Limpsfield Neighbourhood Plan will be held on Thursday 2 May 2019. The question which will be asked in the Referendum will be:

“Do you want Tandridge District Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Limpsfield to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?”

The referendum area and the area covered by the Neighbourhood Plan is the Parish area of Limpsfield (see Appendix 1).

A person is entitled to vote in the Referendum if on 2 May 2019:-

- he or she is entitled to vote in a local government election in the Referendum area; and
- his or her qualifying address for the election is in the Referendum area. A person's qualifying address is, in relation to a person registered in the register of electors, the address in respect of which he or she is entitled to be registered.

The Referendum expenses limit that will apply in relation to the Referendum is £2,528.97. The number of persons entitled to vote in the Referendum, by reference to which the limit has been calculated, is 2,830.

The referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used at local government elections.
